STARTUP LOMITA

2019 STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS

The City of Lomita held its 4th annual State of the City Address during a luncheon at Lomita Park on November 21, 2019. This year's theme was "Start Up Lomita", and highlighted a new business campaign by the new Lomita Chamber of Commerce in the 2020 to attract and retain early-stage and start-up businesses to Lomita.

The City also took the opportunity to present an overview of the City's efforts in the areas of public safety, streets and water infrastructure, and fiscal stability. This year, the City conducted a community survey and the results were no surprise. The message was clear that the City understands the needs and priorities of our community and is working hard towards overcoming the challenges to meet those goals.

Crime prevention remains a top priority, with an 18% decrease in residential burglaries in the last two years and an average emergency response time for service calls at three-minutes. The team at the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department at the Lomita Station, led by the newly appointed Captain Powers, are working hard to build community relations and catch perpetrators for the safety of our community.

The City also continues to focus on ensuring the long term fiscal stability of our community. Recently the City was named by the State Controller among the most fiscally responsible cities in the State. But, we are not without our challenges in the future. In June, the City Council approved a balanced budget for the year with revenues and expenditures totaling approximately \$24.5 million including expected investments in our streets, water system and public safety efforts. Because revenues are traditionally flat, and expenditures continue to climb, the City has put a strong focus on operating more efficiently and finding opportunities to create savings over the long term. This year's budget included the elimination of two management level positions, as well as other cost cutting measures. In the coming years, the City Council will continue to work hard to strategically consider solutions to enhance long term revenues.

Water infrastructure improvements continue to be a priority for our residents as well. This year we were able to replace a major water main under Walnut Street from PCH to 253rd, and at the same time replace a badly rutted and cracked section of street. The City has also received State Approval for the planned Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Filtration System at the Cypress Water Production Facility which will enable the City to remove benzene that was detected at the City's well site and improve the aesthetic qualities of the City's drinking water as well. Currently the City is preparing grant applications for construction of the improvements.

Lomita's streets also continue to be a focus of investment. Over the last few years, the City has been able to replace or refurbish more than two thirds of the streets in the City that for decades had not been properly maintained, increasing the Pavement Condition Index across our community by more than 10 percent. In addition, over the last five years, Lomita has been able to invest over \$5.4 million into the improvement of the street system while at the same time, saving money by combining these with water line improvement projects. As the City has replaced deteriorating water mains underground, we have also benefitted from better streets and improved traffic and pedestrian safety on the street surface.

The City's partnerships with local schools and the recreational programming are also a great benefit for the community. The Drug and Gang Free Walk and the Golden Apple Awards are annual events that bring together law enforcement, teachers, students, and community members to strengthen community ties and recognize those that make a lasting difference in the lives of our youth. With activities available for all age groups, the Lomita Parks and Recreation Division offers a wide variety of programming sure to meet the needs and interests of our residents. In keeping with the partnerships and business theme, the final segment of the address focused on the latest programs and developments that have and continue to strengthen our local economy, provided affordable housing, and support our business community. The development of a new luxury housing complex by the Picerne Group at the corner of Crenshaw and Lomita Blvd is now underway and two mixed-use projects on Narbonne Avenue at 245th and 248th Streets have brought housing and business opportunities to our City, all made possible through partnerships with private developers. The City has partnered directly with local businesses by approving programs that have helped "startup" Lomita. The Business Incentive and Job Creation Program uses federal funding to offer forgivable loans to small businesses that create new jobs in our community. A few entrepreneurs have already taken advantage of the program and it has been a huge success. The City recognized the new businesses that have opened in Lomita just within the last year and introduced the newest "Start Up" and partner, the Lomita Chamber of Commerce. During a question and answer session, Heidi Butzine and Erik Bowman from the Lomita Chamber of Commerce took the opportunity to share the importance of a Chamber and introduced its initiative for the new year to attract and support startup and early stage businesses that complement our business community and support economic growth in Lomita. The goal is to welcome 20 new businesses in 2020. The Chamber is already hard at work promoting the opportunity to partner with Lomita and the potential of investing in our community.

The local business owners in the audience were encouraged to contact the City and Chamber for assistance with their business needs. The collaboration between businesses, the Chamber and the City was cited as an important part of the community's success.


STARTUP LOMITA

At their meeting on December 17th, the City Council conceptually approved a partnership with the New Lomita Chamber of Commerce designed to attract and recruit early stage and star-up businesses to Lomita.

Keeping with the theme for the new year, the Chamber of Commerce has unveiled the new program for calendar year 2020 called "Startup Lomita." The goal of the program is to attract 20 new startup and early stage companies into the City within 2020. With this new program, the Chamber will provide access to workspace, business mailing address, one-on-one coaching and mentorship, business advisory, marketing and legal consulting, and a one-year membership with the Lomita Chamber of Commerce to the first 20 qualified applicants that commit to a minimum one-year business residency in the City of Lomita. Startup Lomita will reach an underserved segment of the community including non-brick-and-mortar businesses that also contribute to Lomita's diversity, and will provide positive media attention for the new businesses and program's efforts.

By reimbursing the Chamber up to \$1,500 for each new eligible business that enrolls in the program, this is another great example of the City's commitment to attract and support small, family-oriented businesses to our community, as well as generate new revenue and jobs while filling vacant commercial space throughout the City.

BEWARE OF JURY DUTY PHONE SCAMS

The Lomita Sheriff's Station is alerting the community about criminals posing as law enforcement officials to scam the public. In these scams, the callers state they are collecting fines to pay off citations for failing to appear in court for jury duty.

During these calls, scammers use many tactics to sound credible. In this case, the scammers have identified themselves as Captain Powers from the Lomita Sheriff Station and tell the victims that they have a signed, certified letter with the jury summons and are instructed to come in to the Lomita Sheriff Station to perform a handwriting exemplar to compare signatures. The suspect also tells the victim that fines for each citation must be paid for failing to appear. The victim is instructed to withdraw cash to make payment at a kiosk, the address of which will be provided when the deposit is ready to be made.

If you believe you are a victim of this fraudulent activity, you are urged to contact the Lomita Sheriff Station immediately to report the incident. The Lomita Sheriff Station is located at 26123 Narbonne Avenue or can be reached at 310-891-3223.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- Neither the Captain nor any Sheriff Deputies make these types of phone calls.
- The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department never conducts this type of business over the phone.
- If there is a warrant for your arrest resulting from a failure to appear, the court will mail a letter.

GRANTS CONTRIBUTE TO BETTER AIR QUALITY IN LOMITA

The City of Lomita is proud to announce that it applied for and received grant funding from the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) and the South Coast Air Quality Management District's (SCAQMD) Clean Transportation Local Government Match Program for three exciting projects.

The City was awarded a MSRC grant in the amount of \$2,500 for the purchase of in-ground mount galvanized steel bicycle parking racks. The City is installing 29 new bicycle racks at locations recommended in the recently adopted 2018 City of Lomita Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan.

Additionally, the City was awarded a MSRC in the amount of \$6,250 for the lease/purchase of an electric vehicle to replace more than 5,000 miles traveled per year using an older, more polluting gasoline engine with cleaner alternative fuel for parking enforcement.

Last but not least, the City was awarded a MSRC grant in the amount of \$24,000 to construct Class II bike lanes along Walnut Street between 253rd and 257th Streets, near Fleming Middle School. The bike lanes are being installed in conjunction with a larger Public Works capital improvement project underway to replace a water main pipe, rehabilitate street pavement, and install ADA compliant curb ramps.



The City of Lomita greatly appreciates the grant support it received from SCAQMD and MSRC, which enabled these projects and helps the City to deliver superior services while improving air quality.

CITY OF LOMITA COMPLETES FOURTEEN WATER INFRASTRUCTURE TOURS IN 2019, ANNOUNCES TOUR SCHEDULE FOR 2020

NEARLY 100 LOMITA RESIDENTS GAIN FIRST-HAND LOOK AT CYPRESS WATER PRODUCTION FACILITY

The City of Lomita completed its fourteenth public tour of the Cypress Water Production Facility on December 21, wrapping up the City's Water Infrastructure Tour program for 2019.

The City announced that the program, which launched in October 2019, will continue into 2020 with tours scheduled to take place one Tuesday and one Saturday each month.

A total of 95 members of the public participated in tours of the Cypress Water Production Facility in 2019. The tours attracted a variety of citizens, ranging from adults well versed about water systems to children interested in learning about how our water is treated and delivered in Lomita.

Lomita residents who participated in the tour appreciated the City's efforts to be proactive and transparent by welcoming the public to tour the facility.

I think it's a great idea [for the City to invite residents to the facility]," said Lomita resident Adam Melendez, who participated in a City Water Infrastructure Tour on December 21. "The City actually cares what we think about the water system, and it's also a pretty modern system and that's good to know."


The Water Infrastructure Tour program provides a forum for residents to get answers to some common water questions and to discuss the City's water supply and upcoming projects and programs. During each tour, participants and City staff discuss important issues including the detection of benzene at the Cypress Water Production Facility and a pollution plume investigation being conducted by Hi-Shear Corporation of Torrance.

"The City launched the Water Infrastructure Tour program to give residents a first-hand look at our water system and to address citizens' questions related to our water. We achieved those goals in 2019, and I'm proud of the program's success so far," said City Manager Ryan Smoot. "We are excited to continue the tour program in 2020, and I encourage our residents to come participate. The more we can engage with our residents on these important topics, the better we can meet their needs going forward."

Water Infrastructure Tours will be conducted each month in 2020, alternating between a Tuesday and a Saturday tour date to best accommodate residents' diverse schedules. Tentative 2020 tour dates are as follows:

2020 CENSUS. SHAPE YOUR FUTURE.

Every 10 years, people across the county and in California fill out the Census in order to have an accurate count of all people in the United States. The Census determines California's federal funding for important community services that help support our families and fair share of representation in California and Washington D.C.

Lomita officials would like to remind residents to complete and return the important 2020 census questionnaire so that Lomita can be assured of receiving the proper allocation of federal funding based on the City's population.

Beginning in mid-March 2020, each household will receive a postcard in the mail informing them of the options for filling out the Census questionnaire, responding either by phone, in paper form, or for the first time online. Census takers will also visit households that do not return the questionnaires to request the information in person. The questionnaire takes about 10 minutes to complete.

Census responses are kept strictly confidential. Under federal law, it is illegal for the Census Bureau to share information about any individual with the police, Immigration, IRS or any other government agency.

Everyone needs to be counted in the City so that Lomita receives its share of funding to help support much needed community programs. Be sure to complete your census form before April 30, 2020. SKATEBOARDING NOT PERMITTED IN DESIGNATED PUBLIC AREAS AND PARKS

Because skateboarding is an inherently dangerous activity, a City ordinance exists to regulate skateboarding and similar recreational activities in certain locations around the City. This is to avoid potential harm or injury to the skaters themselves, others and property.

In Lomita, the ordinance prohibits skateboarding, rollerskating or bicycling in areas designated by a sign on public property, including City Hall and parks, where new signs were recently installed. Those who violate the ordinance can face a fine of twenty-five dollars for the first offense.

Always wear protective safety gear, including helmets, knee and elbow pads that meet current U.S. safety standards. Skateboarding injuries account for thousands of physical injuries each year, mostly involving children.

Long-Time Employee Mike Gonzales retires



LOMITA RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC INFORMATION OPEN HOUSE ON ENVIRONMENTAL INVESTIGATION BY HI-SHEAR

On Thursday, December 5, 2019 approximately 50 Lomita residents attended a Public Information Open House hosted by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) to learn about the ongoing environmental investigation being conducted by the Hi-Shear Corporation (Hi-Shear).

The event, held from 6-8 p.m. at the Lomita Library Don Knabe Community Meeting Room, provided members of the public the opportunity to get information and ask questions about the investigation of soil, soil vapor, and groundwater being conducted by Hi-Shear under the oversight of the Los Angeles Water Board. The Los Angeles Water Board protects surface water and groundwater quality and directs investigation and remediation of sites where soil and groundwater have been contaminated.

Participants enjoyed the self-paced open house format, which allowed them to interact with representatives from the Los Angeles Water Board, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, and the City of Lomita.

"I think what the City is doing here is really good," said Lomita resident Laurie Hurd. "I'm more able to understand what's going on in my community because of the City's transparency. Overall, I learned a lot."

As attendees viewed the Los Angeles Water Board poster boards and spoke with staff, they were provided with information about the ongoing environmental investigation being conducted by Hi-Shear. Clean up efforts at the site, where Hi-Shear has manufactured fasteners for the

aerospace industry since 1954, have been ongoing since 1991 and the site and surrounding areas are being monitored for soil, soil vapor, and groundwater contamination. Based on results of the previous groundwater and soil vapor data, the current investigation by Hi-Shear involves the installation of additional groundwater wells and soil vapor probes at the Hi-Shear site, in the City of Torrance, and within the City of Lomita.

Members of the Lomita City Council, City Manager Ryan Smoot and Public Works Director Carla Dillon participated in the open house to answer residents' questions and share information about how the City is responding to the investigation.

"The City is focused on protecting our residents and ensuring they have all the information they need throughout this investigation," City Manager Smoot said. "We are doing everything we can to ensure a thorough investigation is completed as quickly as possible."

As the investigation progresses, Lomita residents in the area under investigation will continue to receive updates via mail and email from the Los Angeles Water Board directly. They can also continue to visit the City's website for the latest updates and information. Hi-Shear anticipates completing the soil vapor probe and well installations by the first quarter of 2020. Following completion of this phase of the investigation, the Los Angeles Water Board plans to schedule another public meeting to share the results of the investigation and next steps.

BULKY ITEM PICKUPS



Are you moving, remodeling or simply making some changes around your home? The City's trash hauler, CalMet Services, Inc., offers convenient free bulky item and e-waste pick up at no charge. Each single-family residential customer may request up to four free on-call bulky item pick-ups per year (maximum of 6 items per pick-up) and multi-family residential customers will receive one free on-call bulky item pick-up per residential unit within the development. This means you will be able to call for a bulky item pick-up anytime during the year.

Bulky items are large items that will not fit into the trash and recycling containers and include household appliances, mattresses, and furniture. Construction debris (such as concrete and bricks), automobile parts, hazardous materials are not collected and need to be handled separately. Oversized items such as playground sets need to be disassembled and sofas and carpets longer than 5 feet need to be cut in half. Bundled items must be less than 4 feet in length and cannot weigh more than 40 pounds.

All bulky item pick-up requests must be made at least 24 hours prior to your regular trash service day and the items placed at the curb by 6 a.m. on your regular service day.


