



2021 STATE OF THE CITY

On December 1, 2021, the City of Lomita held the 6th Annual State of the City Address, hosted by the Lomita Chamber of Commerce. With a hybrid setting, the theme for this year's event stemmed from our 1st Annual Lemonade Day; "When life gives you lemons...plant seeds for the future".

Over 120 guests listened in as the Mayor Pro-Tem opened the event and took the opportunity to reflect on the City's Covid-19 response efforts. As the pandemic continues to impact all of our lives, the City has been fortunate enough to partner with various community organizations to distribute free food, hand sanitizer, and face masks to offer a helping hand to our residents whenever we can.


Although the pandemic has been fresh in our minds, there is still plenty of work to do in other areas as we support our community. This year the City Council took the opportunity to review and revise its short- and long-term goals for the City. During a Question and Answer session with Heidi Butzine, President and CEO of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce, the Mayor elaborated on the projects, programs and services that have helped us bring those goals to life.

- Lomita has recognized the importance of a safe and local source of water as it continues to invest millions of dollars upgrading and improving our water system. A \$1.1 million grant was awarded for the 247th Street Area Water Main replacement; City crews will begin the project in Summer 2022. Public Works will also continue to slurry resurface 4 of the 7 zones in our City providing safer roads and bringing our vision, those seeds, to life.
- In Downtown Lomita we've continued to be the "Small Town with Big Ideas" to build a vibrant and attractive Downtown core for the community. The new Downtown Lomita Public Plaza converted an empty eyesore of a lot in the heart of Downtown into an additional community space and some much-needed additional parking. The City Council has also approved business incentives to continue to attract new and creative business to our Downtown as well as other areas of the business community
- The City has actively engaged in ensuring public safety. In partnership with the Lomita Sheriffs and Van Lingen Towing, two catalytic converter etching events brought in over 400 vehicles to help prevent theft. In addition, speed radar signs were recently installed near Fleming Middle and St. Margaret Mary schools with dedicated personnel focusing on traffic enforcement in Lomita.
- Although recent state housing bills have added complexity to Lomita's Housing Vision, Lomita's updated Housing Element complies with State mandates to adopt a plan to allow for the possible production of 800 units over the next eight years in a well-planned out way with input from our residents to maintain our quality of life.
- Last November, Lomita residents passed Measure L, our local funding measure that has helped stabilize the City's finances. The City Council is investing these funds into providing essential services, improving water quality, upgrading local infrastructure, small business development and support, workforce training, and public health and workplace safety.

One of the highlights during the State of the City was the unveiling of the new Lomita website! The fresh new website is an important resource to make sure information and services are easily accessible with just a few clicks. Take a look and make sure to bookmark www.LomitaCity.com.

This all came full circle as the Chamber of Commerce introduced Lemonade Day's Winner of the "Lomita Youth Entrepreneur of the Year" and "National Youth Entrepreneur of the Year" Brianna Garcia. Lemonade Day is an event dedicated to teaching youth important business, financial, character-building, and life skills that are the key ingredients of entrepreneurship. In Lomita, nearly 60 students made the commitment to start and run a lemonade stand for a real-life entrepreneurial experience. The Chamber intends on making Lemonade Day Lomita an annual signature event and has planted the seed for the next generation to become the business leaders, social advocates, community volunteers and forward-thinking citizens of tomorrow.

LOMITA PARK GYMNASIUM NAMED IN HONOR OF MARC FOSNAUGH



A dedication ceremony was recently attended by close family and friends of Marc Fosnaugh at Lomita Park to witness the unveiling of the Marc Fosnaugh Gymnasium at the Tom Rico Center a year after his unexpected passing.

Lomita resident and Recreation Supervisor Marc Fosnaugh impacted the lives of many residents in Lomita during his 28 years working at Lomita Park, many of whom requested the City make a permanent recognition of his contributions.

To honor Marc, additional lettering reading "Marc Fosnaugh Gymnasium" was added to the exterior of the building arched over the current Lomita Park signage at the Tom Rico Center. A new center court logo with "Marc Fosnaugh Gymnasium" was installed in the interior of the gymnasium as well as the addition of the City's logo surrounded by "Marc Fosnaugh Gymnasium" at the top and the "Tom Rico Center" lettering at the bottom was placed on the north interior wall of the gymnasium. These improvements to the interior and exterior of the building serve as lasting memorials to Marc's commitment to Lomita's basketball programs and his time devoted to Lomita sports and the lives he shaped as a coach, mentor, friend, neighbor, and colleague.

The building known as the Tom Rico Center was dedicated in 2004 in honor of Lomita resident and Commissioner Tom Rico for his contributions to the City of Lomita.



Lomita Remembers Las Vegas Victims with Memorial at Teuchert Park



The Lomita City Council, family and community members recently gathered at Teuchert Park to unveil a memorial in remembrance of Lomita resident Lisa Patterson and other victims of the Las Vegas mass shooting that took place during a country music festival in 2017.

The memorial was incorporated into a previously unfinished section of Teuchert Park and included installation of an angel statue with a heart engraved with an inscription dedicated

to Lisa and a pathway leading to it with individual bricks inscribed with the names of the victims of the shooting. Improvements to the park also included a wood arbor consisting of stone veneer and a hanging bench swing, as well as new decomposed granite, pathways, trees, decorative boulders, and a sundial.



Elected officials and members of the Patterson family reflected on the impact of the attack, shared their sorrows, inspirations, and the special significance of this local tribute, followed by the official unveiling of the angel statue by Lisa Patterson's family.

Louis and William J. Teuchert Park, located at 1836-1850 259th Place, was dedicated on April 25, 2017 and was made possible by a generous donation of land by long time Lomita resident Louis Teuchert and funding from the Los Angeles County Park and Open Space District. The project transformed a former single family residential lot into a vibrant, lush garden with A.D.A. compliant walking paths and benches for residents to enjoy the tranquility.

The design, materials and labor to construct the memorial have all been made possible through the generous donations from Lomita businesses: Luigi Schiappa Development, Thompson Building Supply and Robert Patterson Hardwood Floors.

TORRANCE TO INSTALL NEW AIRPORT NOISE MONITORING SYSTEM

In December, the City of Torrance approved reinstating a noise abatement system, which would enable Torrance to monitor and reduce the aircraft noise originating from the Zamperini Field and restore enforcement. Our cities received an increase in complaints from residents living in the vicinity when the airport noise monitoring system was taken out of services last October.

It is anticipated that the new system will be operational within 4-6 months. Lomita residents with concerns regarding noise at the airport should continue to contact the Torrance Noise Abatement Center via email at NoiseAbatementProgram@TorranceCA.gov or by phone (310) 784-7950 to report their concerns.

PLEASE USE WATER WISELY

In response to Metropolitan Water District declaring a regional drought emergency and West Basin Municipal Water District escalating from shortage Level 1 to Level 3 in response to an anticipated shortage of 21-30%, the City Council adopted a resolution activating Level 1 of the City's Water Shortage Contingency Plan to conserve water during the current drought conditions. This took effect on December 31, 2021.

In early July, the Governor called upon residents to voluntary reduce water consumption by 15% and during this time period, Lomita's water consumption has been reduced by 5.2%. Lomita is doing its part to conserve water and it is important to keep this going. Water your lawns sparingly, repair leaks, and continue following the water saving measures until drought conditions subside. The City may escalate to Water Shortage Level 2 or 3 of the Contingency Plan to coincide with the State and other water agencies.

ORGANICS WASTE RECYCLING REQUIREMENT COMING TO LOMITA

Organics Recycling is Changing in Lomita

Residents across California will soon see changes to the way organic waste is disposed of and recycled. Signed into law in 2016, California Senate Bill 1383 established a statewide goal to reduce the amount of organic waste disposed of in landfills by 75%. The bill also set a goal to recover at least 20% of edible food waste by 2025.

Effective January 1, 2022, all single-family residential, multi-family residential, and businesses will be required to participate in organic recycling. Lomita, together with CalMet Services, will launch a new Organics Recycling Program to help everyone navigate the requirements for this state-mandated measure and to educate residents on the proper way to sort organic waste at home.

The City will initiate a pilot program for residential collection in the Spring of 2022.

Organic waste includes food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste.

- Ask residents to dispose of their organic material in their existing green waste bin
- Create opportunities for businesses, grocery stores and restaurants to donate edible food to food banks for those in need
- Reserve California's valuable landfill space for only products that cannot be recycled
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions




NEW REGISTRATION SYSTEM FOR RECREATION PROGRAMMING

Proof of residency must be established at the time of registration. Lomita residents must provide either a California Drivers License/ID card or a current utility bill issued within the last 60 days.


